BESU and ALUMNI

In western countries, especially in North America, one can see a special bond between an alumnus and his/her *alma mater*. For some reason, this kind of a bond is not seen in India except for a few institutes. One such exception is found in our *alma mater*. The special relationship between BEC/ BECDU/ BESU and its alumni has grown over the years. One reason for this growth may be the cohesive nature of the student body. Whatever be the reason, our alumni community has always been proud of our *alma mater* and takes pride in serving her in different capacities.

Prior to the formation of an association, alumni groups from different parts of the world used to do their best in helping our *alma mater*. Once the Global Alumni Association was formed and registered in 2005, it provided a platform to bring all alumni together and expand the relationship to be mutually respectful, beneficial and rewarding lasting forever. However, relationships can only blossom if both sides are responsible and have a commitment to each other. Initially, BESU provided fund to set up the office which was a great help. GAABESU, in turn, started several initiatives to help students, alumni and faculty of BESU in the form of scholarship, mentorship and financial aid in emergency. Also it has started planning for completely refurbishing the swimming pool using the membership fees collected in foreign currencies. It also recommended eminent academicians (who are ex-students) to represent alumni to the BESU Court (its highest policy making body). Alumni all over the world cordially hosted BESU faculty and administration while they visited countries abroad.

Now questions come, have we achieved our goals? When we see the administration discarding prominent academicians (who could guide BESU during the transition to an INI) as the alumni representatives to the Court, we wonder what the reason could be. Does it mean that the administration do not care for our opinion? Nobody knows. As far as the role of alumni in improving our *alma mater* is concerned, we are even more perplexed about their attitudes. We have noticed that most of alumni all over the world participate spontaneously in social events. But when we ask them to participate in activities to help the *alma mater*, they show a profound lack of interest. We don't know why they are not willing to participate in activities beyond social events. Why do we not see much interest among the alumni visiting BESU in building a strong relationship with faculty and in exchanging students with their institutes? Other side of this problem is lack of our understanding of the role and responsibilities of BESU towards alumni. We need to find out if BESU is even interested in reaching out to the alumni or to acknowledge their help towards the *alma mater*.

A short Biography of Amarendranath Datta:

Born on 7th August, 1935, Mr. Dutta breathed his last on 23rd March, 2008. He was schooled at Scottish Church Collegiate School, received his B. Arch degree from Bengal Engineering College in 1961

and MS in Architecture from North Dakota State University in 1968.

He started his profession at Seattle as an architectural consultant, and came back in India in October, 1979 to join Ghosh Bose and Associates. In his long professional career, he was associated in designing numerous buildings. Among them, the buildings for SAIL on J. L. Nehru Road, SBI Main Branch on Strand Road, NUJS on EM Bypass, Purbachal Housing, Philips Factory and Patna Planetarium deserve special mention.

GAABESU Emergency Fund

GAABESU Emergency Fund Committee thanks all donors who have generously contributed for our fellow alumni in need (Kripamoy Mondal and Kamal Das). GAABESU has now stopped taking donations for Kripamoy Mondal and Kamal Das.
